Website with Embedded Forum:

- Announcements:

- Allow administrators to create announcements for project news or events.

- Dynamic Section Creation:

- AI Bot:




Figure 1: Website Home Page (screenshot 1 of 4)

About Us

The context

A clear need exists for the Cancer Inequalities Registry in the EU, which strives to provide a regular reporting mechanism based on cancer indicators covering the whole cancer control continuum complemented by analytical reports providing contextual information and qualitative assessments. The Cancer Inequalities Registry will make available comparable up-to-date cancer indicators in a systematic and easily accessible way to the general public and policy-makers by building on existing reporting quantitative data and indicators collected for instance through the augmented European Cancer Information System, the European Statistical System (Eurostat) and from other data sources.

OriON JA will contribute to the development of an online platform (developed through the contribution agreement to the European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies – OHS) that will capture the health systems progress made along the publication of the PReCaT Ja roadmap and with pre-empting national cancer control policies. The online platform is envisaged to cover the following domains:

- a. Primary prevention and health promotion
- b. Cancer screening
- c. Diagnostics and treatment
- d. Cancer care

The aim of the OriON JA is to make available a timely qualitative analysis of the national cancer control situation in the European Member States, including the state of play of implementation of the ESCOP at national level as well as to make available data and insights on socio-economic








Figure 7: Events Page




Figure 8: Forum Page (not logged in)




Figure 9: News Page





Figure 10: Contact Page




Figure 12: User Profile Page




Figure 13: Forum Page (Logged In)
